OUR PICKS

KANSAS CITY PROTECTS ITS OWN

Since the inception of the second Trump term, a new energy has been brought to the city-one where people who have not historically been involved in politics feel called to advocacy. Grassroots organizations like Boots on the Ground Midwest and Midtown KC Now, along with community members across the city, have coordinated crucial workshops and events to help educate citizens on how to protect themselves and their neighbors.

While decisions made from the highest office in the land continue to plague communities and roll back long-fought civil protections, both across the country and in our own backyard, being equipped with the tools to thwart abuses of power has become more important than ever before.

Recent community training efforts have taken the form of teach-ins that not only educate people on the misconceptions surrounding immigration, but also offer rapid-response training that teaches what to do if someone spots ICE activity in their area. This trend has also included workshops that prepare the public for basic disaster response, covering events such as floods, terrorism, or other hazards requiring immediate medical attention.

This blooming in community training culture and intervention has transformed local activism from mere performativity to serious action. Get out and get involved. Your neighbor needs you.

RACHEL MCCARTHY JAMES' BOOK WHACK JOB CUTS DEEP

Lawrence-based writer Rachel McCarthy James spent the last few years digging into the history of a singular object, and what her Indiana Jones-style research turned up is an object of extreme and terrible power-i.e., a must-have for your bookshelf and easily the best stocking stuffer our book writers will recommend for this holiday season.

Whack Job: A History of Axe Murder is the story of the axe: tool, weapon, and status symbol of culture and technology through the ages. First as a convenient danger and then an anachronism, this examination is told through the murders it has been employed in throughout history and covers a dizzying swathe of history. Like a bloody version of Bill Bryson's At Home: A Short History of Private Life or Consider the Fork: A History of How We Cook and Eat by Bee Wilson filtered through the vibrant readability of Mary Roach, James' Whack Job is a book that you'll find utterly unputdownable.

While your staples of the true crime genre, a la Lizzie Borden, have their appearances here, they all arrive in forms and from perspectives that are truly peerless in that entire sphere of storytelling. Inherent in this separation is the mix of anthropological know-how mixed with Midwestern sass

that allows James to spit in the face of longstanding narratives. What she offers is less a listing of people felled by the bladed instrument and more of a holistic look at how and why this object took such a profound place in cultures across continents and centuries.

At points, the axe is a weapon of ultimate revenge, while other cultures considered it such a utilitarian instrument that its mere creation could be proof that a man had the personality type required to befriend and inspire people from across a spectrum of allegiances. Yes, making your own axe could be proof that you would be a good husband because it meant you probably had the temperament to get along with folks from all walks of life. Like we said, this book is wild.

James' work is a page turner, her voice in this space is singular, and the wit cuts like a blade. Whack Job is truly the high watermark for lit in the region this year, and you owe it to yourself to track this one down.

PINK PONY CLUB OVERRUNS MIDTOWN FOR CHAPPELL ROAN WEEKEND

October's spookiest event didn't revolve around an outdated haunted house in the West Bottoms or a movie marathon at Screenland. Rather, the return of the Midwest Princess to her homeland made for the scariest spectacle of the year.

Chappell Roan, launching a limited Visions of Damsels & Other Dangerous Things Tour (for basically just us), overtook WWI Memorial Park—and every other facet of the city. Across two nights, more than 60k people attended the dual gigs, while navigating the infrastructure and crosstown travel for a venue that rarely hosts any spectacle of this size. Drowning in a sea of pink, wigs, and cowboy hats, the most age-diverse crowd we've ever seen partied the night away. It's a rare thing to catch a family of eight dancing with an absolutely obliterated set posse

of drag queens, at least out in the *normal* world, but at the Pink Pony Club, the unrelenting party kept space for all invited.

Roan herself took command of a Maleficent-style Disney haunted castle set, backed by Don Bluth-style animation, and floored us with one of the best live voices we've ever heard—plowing through every track in her catalogue, along with a cover of "Barracuda" that's destined to soundtrack movie trailers for years to come. Her band provided a heavy-metal flair to the pop anthems, almost taunting us with the talent on display.

But Roan's event was much, much more than just the show itself. Pop-ups across the city made certain to highlight local businesses, creatives, and makers, with the princess putting all her power into guaranteeing that the scene from her origin story was backed, both in exposure and in financial boon. Multiple LGBTQ+-owned businesses and drag bars were part of the officially distributed weekend guide, and drag performers served as opening acts for both shows. Seeing local superstars get to push their personal Venmos for show tips, out to an all-ages sea of people, was the most "KC thing" that The Pitch has seen from a hometown hero in quite some time.

The planning and execution, on stage and off, was not just the definition of a Fem-

ininomenon but genuinely the standard by which future visiting superstars will be held. This wasn't just a show; this was *everything*.

KC'S COFFEE CULTURE GREW AT ESPRESSO-FUELED SPEED

Kansas City craves caffeine and yearns for third spaces. At least that's one takeaway from our non-stop coffee shop culture. New spots with distinct identities opened in the last year, such as Good Karma Coffee, Origin Coi Nguon Coffeehouse, Pitchside Coffee, Cortadito, Penrose Espresso Bar, Le Champion, and even coffee/matcha carts. We also saw the expansion of established spots like Café Corazón, Sweet Tee's, and Grand Coffee.

Not only did cafe openings outpace closures, but most of the new spots didn't stop at coffee. Good Karma hosts a variety of after-hours events and socials. Le Champion converts to a cocktail bar in the afternoon. Pitchside frequently invites food vendors to pop up so guests can linger longer.

Between expanding the expectations of a coffee shop and having a baseline menu of relatively inexpensive items (<\$10), local spots continue to bridge the gap for large groups of people that weren't as large a few years ago: non-drinkers who still want somewhere to hang out and socialize, remote workers needing a change of scenery,



and individuals who seek irl connection after the glimmer of internet fades... all while leaning into "little treat culture".

No matter the state of the economy, little treat culture prevails. When things are good, celebrate life and treat yourself. When things are down, you deserve a treat. You can't afford a home, and you're not one to spend big on cars or bags, so little treats are practically self-care, right?

Most of us? We're skipping the 'bucks and Dutch Bros for local spots that offer pockets of respite, connection, and fun alongside our caffeinated bevvie of choice.

MELINDA RYDER'S HALF-CENTURY CENTER-STAGE

When it comes to drag, some could argue

that Melinda Ryder has been the best for 50 years. Since the late '70s, she has absolutely dominated the scene, winning Miss Gay Missouri 1979, Miss Gay Kansas City America 1982, Miss Gay Missouri America 1984, and 2nd Alternate to Miss Gay America 1985.

Bruce Winter—the person behind the Melinda Ryder personality—made his way to Kansas City from St. Louis in 1975, set up shop, and never left. To this day, Winter can still be seen as Ryder around town, most recently featured at The Museum of Kansas City, showcasing the exhibit, *Arrive As A Star. Leave As A Star.*, which is on display through February of next year. How lucky are we?

What is truly mesmerising about Ryder's legacy is that it never diminished, coming on 50 whole years still completely intact. The same cannot be said about most drag pioneers, as there has been a drive to mass erase queer existence from the country's historical documentation. Fortunately, Ryder never fell victim to this blatant eradication. That resistance can be partially attributed to the City of Kansas City.

Individuals within our cherished Midwest metropolis noticed the disparity when it comes to historical queer representation and have worked to ensure that records remain. While The Museum of Kansas City is the organization that spearheaded this for Ryder, the city as a whole continuously works to transparently portray drag in the community.

Currently, Ryder is working on a documentary with director John Crite, titled *Melinda Ryder; Still Here*, further highlighting her decades' worth of work and significance within Kansas City's queer scene. Melinda Ryder is truly one of one. And her impact on the city will last forever.

UNEVEN SEASONS KEEP TOP ATHLETES ON THEIR TOES

Let's be honest. For the last few years, Kansas City has been absolutely spoiled when it comes to our professional sports teams.

The Chiefs claimed back-to-back Super Bowl Championships in 2022 and 2023, the Royals scraped up enough wins last season to make a postseason push, even winning the wildcard round against the Baltimore Orioles, and the Current placed fourth in the NWSL 2024 Season, playing their first games on CPKC Stadium grass. I mean, you can't ask for much more from your three core sporting groups.

But that changed this past year. Yes, the Chiefs continued their dominant run throughout the regular season and most of the playoffs, but they didn't get it done. Their chances at being the first team to ever win three consecutive Super Bowls came to a devastating ending when the Philadelphia Eagles got revenge for their 2022 championship loss to the team, pummelling Andy Reid and the crew 40-22 in Vegas.

Our standards may be high, but regardless of any accomplishments made throughout this past season, if we don't win the Super Bowl, all of the work put in feels like a waste. And this 2025 season hasn't quite kicked off on the best note, either, as the team is 4-3 at the time of this writing, with our three victories sparking the remergence of the 'ref conspiracy theories' that have long haunted the team.

As far as the Royals go, disappointment is the standard. But after a successful 2024 season, attitudes toward the team around the city had shifted from awaiting an inevitable letdown to a slight sense of faith, especially considering the contract extension of star shortstop Bobby Witt Jr. And as the team remained in the wildcard hunt as August approached, that faith was worthy. Our friends by the riverfront are no strangers to winning, currently leading the NWSL with a record of 20-3-2—eight wins ahead of the current second-place team at the time of this writing. By the time this magazine hits stands, the regular season will be completed and the team will be gearing up for the playoffs. Given the success that the soccer stars have had, led by most recent league MVP Temwa Chawinga, a long playoff run and hoisting of the trophy seem to be right around the corner.

At a time when we are unsure if the Chiefs are the Chiefs and we now know that the Royals are still the Royals, it is nice to take a stroll to the only women's soccer stadium in the world and watch our players absolutely dismantle opponents. Head up to CPKC Stadium to cheer on the team in teal as they push for the 2025 NWSL Championship.

JIMI POE BECOMES THE OWNER OF THE STATE'S FIRST MICROBUSINESS DISPENSARY

Over the summer, Platte City granted a warm welcome to a new neighbor, 816 Dispensary—the first microbusiness dispensary to open in the state. When Missourians voted for legal cannabis in the state, law-makers paved a way for disadvantaged individuals to own a business in the industry. As a result, the social equity cannabis microbusiness program was established.

In order to be eligible for a microbusiness license, applicants must meet one of the five following criteria: have a net worth under \$250,000; have disabled veteran status; have been convicted of a nonviolent marijuana felony; reside in a low-income zip code; or have graduated from an unaccredited school.

816 Dispensary Owner Jimi Poe qualifies due to a nonviolent marijuana conviction that he received in 2007. What had previously haunted his reputation now serves as the sole reason why he was able to start the business in the first place. And while he was shy to make his felony known previously, he now has it hanging within the walls of 816 Dispensary for all visitors to see.

After opening in June, 816 Dispensary is still working on getting up to speed, currently only holding a few different strains of flower and pre-rolls from three microbusiness wholesalers in the state. But Poe says this will soon change. By the time this magazine hits stands, he is hopeful that his shop will be stocked with edibles and vape car-

tridges now that the wholesalers have had more time to settle into the work.

The opening of 816 Dispensary shows that this microbusiness program can at least get a licensee to the finish line. Whether or not the small niche within the cannabis industry can be prosperous or not will be known once more microbusinesses reach commencement and have time to make waves in the market. Until then, Poe is deserving of a pat on the back, given the fact that 34 of the 96 awarded licenses have been revoked since the program's emergence.

DOCUMENTARY SOUNDS OF THE CITY IS A MUSICAL LOVE LETTER TO KC

Before director Dustin Phillips completed his project *Sounds of the City* this year, finding information on the city's historical involvement in the evolution of music was tough to come across. Now, Kansas Citians can turn to the 2025 documentary that historically lists Kansas City's influence within music culture since the 1920s.

The doc hits on all of KC's guidance in the subculture from the early jazz pioneers such as Bennie Moten, Count Basie, and Charlie 'Bird' Parker, to some of the acts that you may see today perusing through town.

Throughout Phillips' production, he makes it clear where the different genres of music intersect, which, in turn, shaped the melodic scene throughout the metro, then shaping sound throughout the nation.

Many thanks must be given to Phillips, considering that, without *Sounds of the City*, much of this historical context can be lost

and washed down over time. Phillips paints a clear picture of what music was then, what it is now, and what it may be.

UNICORN THEATRE'S FIRE WORK STAGED DYSTOPIAN COLLISION BETWEEN CHARLES SCHULZ AND CHILD LABOR

One stage play in 2025 took us all by storm, and *The Pitch* is ride or die for a little show that delivered a delightfully horrible time—thanks to the killer creatives over at Unicorn Theatre

fire work is exactly what we yearn for when we crave clever criticism, and the Orwellian comedy of the whole thing does what satire has failed to do in our modern era: find a way to escalate beyond how fucking bad things have gotten.

Director Katie Gilchrist and playwright Mary Glen Fredrick set the scene of a dystopian industrial hellscape, where a group of children aged six to 12 live alone in the ruins of whatever came before. They work long hours of grueling labor in a struggle to stay alive—and even to help fiscally support their own parents, wherever they might be. Despite the bleak conditions, the youth are enraged by a new law that the local politicians seem set to approve: banning child labor for those under a certain age. What should seem like progress is instead met with feral frustration as the kids themselves move to stop said legislation for fear that they will be unable to work and, therefore, die penniless.

Like the violent frustration of an animal forced to gnaw off its own arm to es-

cape a trap, no recent original stage play has made the audience laugh while tasting the blood of the moment so memorably. Pulling from *Mad Max, Oliver Twist,* and *Disco Elysium* equally, you'd need to hunt down future productions of *You're a Good Comrade, Charlie Brown!*

FEARLESS JACK RABBIT STANDS TALL IN RIVERSIDE

By the time our annual Best Of magazine hits stands, Jeff Parson—the face behind Fearless Jack Rabbit Art—will be halfway done crafting his collection of Kansas City Chiefs yard art. What started out as an avenue for self-expression has led to a seven-year tradition in Riverside.

The local artist paints wood carvings that resemble members of the hometown team, adding a new player to the yard each week. By the end of the NFL Season, Parson has a whole gang of Chiefs in his yard, along with locals wanting to take a closer look at the art and snap photos.

But Parson's artistic expertise is not merely centered around painting buff football bros; his portfolio runs deep, whether that be his yard art, his mural at B.B.'s Lawnside BBQ, his numerous pieces for rock band Jackyl, or his personal collection that the public may never have a chance to lay eyes on.

What makes the Riverside dweller's art so eccentric is that everything he does has purpose. While his yard art started as his own desire, it transitioned into a way for him to give back to his community. Now, there are musicians, television and movie characters, drag queens, and much more.

In all of Parson's art, intentionality and passion can be found. He seems to never really put the brush down, and for good reason. Riverside residents are lucky that they

have such easy and free access to one-of-a-kind craftsmanship in their neighborhood.

"CLUBBING" FINDS NEW FORMS FOR A REINVENTION GENERATION

Though we don't think people really say "going clubbing" anymore, it used to imply late nights, dark clubs, drugs and alcohol, hookups, and cover charges. In 2025, Kansas City experienced a shift in club culture: not taking anything away from the late-

night scene, only adding to it. Cover charges remain, but other aspects of clubbing have become more inclusive.

Now, there are more opportunities than ever to see and be seen, dance, and hear DJ sets (for better or worse). Only now, it may happen at 9 a.m., or be held at a coffee shop, or be a completely dry event. For example, Cougar Club and its monthly dance parties target the 35 and older crowd, promising guests access to shake their asses on a week-

night, then be home and in bed with their skincare routine complete by 11 p.m.

Other new parties bring the club environment to the other half of the day. AM Club is exactly as it sounds, creating a popup joint in a coffee shop or non-traditional location at 9 a.m. There is no alcohol served at most AM Club events, and it takes the club mentality even further in the opposite direction by kicking off the day with a run, cold plunge, and massage before turning down the lights and bringing out the DJ. Caféton brings a Latin lounge atmosphere to Café Corazón, also at 9 a.m., with a darty centered around Latin beats, community, and strong coffee or yerba mate.

As fewer people choose to drink alcohol but still prioritize social connections, what transformations will we be observing in 2030? For now, we're loving that both types of "clubbing" exist.

LAUREN LOVELLE & THE MIDNIGHT SPLIFFS SPARK THE FLAME

Making music was always in the cards for Lauren Lovelle, as she has been accompanying her dad's band, Two Way Traffic, since she was just four years old. With musical backgrounds on both sides of her family, it's no surprise that she now heads her own act, Lauren Lovelle & The Midnight Spliffs.

Her father grew up in the church, where he found a passion for music and received traditional training singing hymns. His love for music-making carried on outside of the





religious walls, blending into an affection for folk, country, and blues. This expansion from traditional liturgical melodies transitioned on with Lovelle, as her paternal grandfather taught her to pick up a guitar.

Lovelle says that she got involved with a top 40 cover band shortly after graduating high school, but that came to a screeching halt. And after listening to the band's EP, *Other Dreams*, it makes sense why she may go crazy covering Lady Gaga and Journey when she has so much to offer herself.

Lovelle and The Spliffs have built some chemistry throughout the years, and it shows on *Other Dreams*, as the songs are incredibly strong and vibrant, despite the project being only four tracks. In spite of its short composition, the diversity is there, as "Anxiously Attached" offers soulful swing with Devon Teran's pedal steel, while "Won't Tell You Goodbye" puts the Lovelle vocals at the forefront of the tune.

The instrumentation and lyrics throughout offer a strange experience to listeners. While some tracks may be upbeat, like closing tune "In My Jeans", there is still emotional baggage behind every word, making Lauren Lovelle & The Midnight Spliffs' intricate project an easy favorite of ours.

Q KC IS WHERE THE BEAT MEETS BELONGIN'

Q KC may be new, but it has the aura of being there for ages. You can sense it as soon as you walk in: the neon lights flashing, the bass pumping through your whole body, and the hum of conversation beneath it all. To exclusively call it a club would be an understatement, as this is a space where KC's queer community comes to life.

DJs keep the floor moving with everything from high-energy hits to deep, sticky grooves, local drag queens command the stage with ferocious confidence, and the crowd follows them, enthralled by the unapologetic self-representation. Even the quieter corners buzz with life, as friends share stories over drinks and romances ignite.

Beyond its nightlife, Q KC is a center for creativity and connection. Local creatives infuse the space with artistry and pride every night. The layout of the club is intentionally designed with crowded dance floors to make your heart race, while hidden sofas and an outdoor patio encourage secluded conversation and laughter.

In a city that's always changing, Q KC isn't just keeping up; it's setting the standard. The best nights out aren't remembered for the lights, music, and cocktails, but rather for discovering a place where you fit in. Q KC serves as an incredibly inclusive host for some of the most intriguing nights out.

RAINY DAY BOOKS MACHINE PUNCHES ABOVE ITS WEIGHT

Fairway's Rainy Day Books is a modest powerhouse when it comes to bringing giants of the literary world—in what seems like every week—to Kansas City for our enrichment. This year, they're celebrating 50 years as a bookish beacon.

From Pulitzer Prize-winning authors like Percival Everett (*James*) to notable White House journalists Jonathan Allen and Amie Parnes (*Fight: Inside the Wildest Battle for the White House*), Rainy Day Books has a knack for spotlighting local voices while also bringing incredible national talent to the Midwest.

These efforts are community-centered and hardly cost-prohibitive. When you attend Rainy Day Books events, you not only receive a copy of the featured work, but also a rare opportunity to interact with some of your favorite authors.

However, outstanding events hosted by this team might go unnoticed if you don't keep a close eye out. We recommend you follow this local indie gem on their social media, including their Eventbrite page, to stay in the know of all the good they're doing around town. Who knows? Maybe the author of your most prized piece of literature is right around the corner.

BRUCE BRESLOW'S DECADES OF MARBLE MUSE

Bonner Springs is home to one of the metro's most unique craftsmen: Bruce Breslow. After a trip to Iowa in his twenties, he snagged a jar of marbles from an antique shop. Fascinated by the swirling spheres, Breslow knew he wanted to begin making his own.

Formerly serving the community as a woodworker, he transitioned his then business, Bruce's Woodworks, to Moon Marble Company at 600 East Front St. Since the inception of the business, Breslow has worked steadily in his shop, crafting some of the smallest, yet most eccentric pieces of art that Bonner Springs has to offer.

As far as his style goes, he takes a few different routes when configuring his art. He says that there have been plenty of times that he has mixed a few colors together by accident, only for them to result in intricate patterns.

At his brick-and-mortar, Breslow hosts free demonstrations for members of the community to take a glance at his process. Kansas Citians gather in Breslow's establishment, accompanied by the shop cat, Ringer, as they watch the man mold colorful glass into illuminated balls.

Breslow and his business Moon Marble Company are a reminder that, regardless of your age, it is never too late to find passion, take on a new task, and develop a fresh skill set. His slight spark of curiosity on a random vacation has ultimately led to a lifelong vocation and career, and Bonner Springs residents get to reap the benefits.

Attendees can expect a rich tapestry of sounds, centered around R&B, Latin, and hip-hop.

WE WANT FLORA FROM KANSAS TO COME HOME

Flora from Kansas isn't your average Lawrence teenager donning Jayhawks gear.

OUR PICKS

She is a worldwide music sensation. After the release of her EP Keep Calling in 2021 and her full-length cassette Emerald City in 2022, she went ghost.

For two years, the artist refrained from releasing any new music. However, that hiatus broke in November of last year when the UK's Melodic Records announced the signing of the artist. Shortly after, her project Homesick, a six-track EP, was released in March 2025, which was mixed by highly acclaimed producer Ali Chant.

Since its release, Flora from Kansas has gained international attention, as NPR selected one of her songs to be played on its "The songs we can't stop playing this week" series, also receiving regular airplay on the BBC.

Offering our ears to the artist, it is easy to see why this Midwestern teen has gained such appreciation, specifically overseas. We eagerly await Flora from Kansas to return to Lawrence or KC for well-deserved spotlight, although it appears that global stages far, far away are destined for the young artist.

SWEET AND SAVORY AT SEVEN SWANS CREPERIE

Sevens Swans Creperie-crepe you very much! Founded locally in 2020 by Kate Bryan, Seven Swans captures the homey, cozy feeling of eating in your grandma's kitchen paired with divinely decadent recipes. With locally- and organically-sourced ingredients, including coffee served by Oddly Correct, this creperie remained a standout this year.

The menu rotates throughout the 365

days to keep ingredients fresh according to the season, while maintaining fan favorites year-round. The offerings range from savory to sweet, with vegan and gluten-free options available. From the savory side of the fall menu, the Vermonter is a mouth-watering choice with rosemary sausage, sharp white cheddar cheese, and caramelized apples, topped with rosemary. If fall means sitting around the bonfire making s'mores, the campfire sweet crepe is for you, featuring chocolate ganache and marshmallows, topped with housemade graham crackers, whipped cream, and a toasted mallow.

The space is thoughtfully decorated with a timeless, European folk-tale-inspired $\,$ motif. All of their dishes are thrifted and unique, adding to the cozy atmosphere. It only seats up to 45 guests at a time and doesn't accept reservations, but the crepes are well worth the wait.

KANSAS CITY'S STAGE **BELONGS TO LANA LUXX**

When Lana Luxx steps on stage, the city pays attention. As a full-time drag performer and trans activist, she has revolutionized Kansas City's nightlife into a showcase of spectacle, turning her performances into high-production events that feel more like pop-star world tours than bar acts. With regular appearances at Hamburger Mary's, Missie B's, and Brick's Pub & Grub, she has become one of the city's most visible and celebrated entertainers. This year, she also opened for drag icon and former Drag Race USA winner Sasha Colby, cementing her place among the most exciting performers working today.

Her creativity shines brightest in her Taylor Swift drag revue shows, where she reimagines the pop icon's eras with original looks and electrifying energy. At KC Pride this year, she performed as Taylor Swift for family day, giving children the opportunity to "meet" one of their heroes.

Surpassing the glamour, however, is her impact through her authenticity. Luxx first made national headlines in 2015 as Missouri's first transgender homecoming queen-a trailblazing moment of representation that emboldens trans youth today.

Her profession is now defined by the same tenacity and honesty. Luxx has taken her platform into activism as the grand marshal of the Kansas City Pride Parade, powerfully advocating for her community. Drag is more than a mere spectacle to her; it's self-affirmation and a means of LGBTQ+ portrayal within the metro.

Luxx exemplifies both bravery and creativity in a city that thrives on both. Her activism is the only thing that can match her artistic talent, demonstrating the importance of drag in Kansas City's narrative. Luxx is here to transform what it means to belong in more spaces than just the spot-

light, although that is exactly where she should be.

ARTSKC CONSTRUCTS THE FUTURE OF LOCAL CREATIVES

For 25 years, the heart of Kansas City's creative community has been founded in ArtsKC, as the organization ensures that artists and audiences get the tools and exposure they need to thrive. As the region's nonprofit arts council, they serve five counties with a mission that blends funding, advocacy, and connection.

2025 has been historic. With performances by Ensemble Ibérica, the Ernest Melton Trio, Owen/Cox Dance, and Stone Lion Puppet Theatre, ArtsKC held a well-deserved celebration for its 25th anniversary with a grand event at CPKC Stadium. In addition to commemorating a quarter-century of influence, this milestone demonstrated the vibrancy and diversity of the Kansas City subculture today.

That momentum soon brought national recognition. Earlier this year, ArtsKC was selected to join the Bloomberg Philanthropies Digital Accelerator Program, becoming the first Missouri organization invited into this innovative cohort. The initiative helps cultural nonprofits build digital capacity and deepen audience engagement—an investment in the arts ecosystem's long-term resilience.

Grantmaking remains central to ArtsKC's work, having supplied Mission Support Grants worth \$215,000 to support dozens of local arts nonprofits. But ArtsKC's impact goes far beyond grant dollars. Their Marketing Capacity Program gives small and mid-size arts organizations the tools and coaching they need to grow, while ArtsKCGo.com serves as a go-to hub for

events, artists, and venues across the region. Through their Now Showing program, they bring art into mundane spaces to transform lobbies and workplaces into galleries where local artists receive fair compensation and visibility while keeping 100% of their sales.

At its core, ArtsKC remains an advocate for the local creative scene, bringing together civic leaders, enhancing the arts' cultural and economic influence, and guaranteeing fair access throughout the metro. Their work in 2025 serves as a stark reminder that Kansas City's arts sector is nurtured, supported, and developed with a purpose.

WAREHOUSE ON BROADWAY'S ELONGATED SQUISH-SPACE PULLS IN ECCENTRIC ACTS

Over at 3951 Broadway in Westport, a building that has cycled purposes dozens of times over the years landed the spinner with a variation on a previous purpose, with Warehouse on Broadway re-launching as a music venue with both tonal and physical twists on the norm. When Riot Room closed during the pandemic, it left a hole in the market for a mix of hip hop, EDM, metal, and indie shows for a mid-tier venue size. For genre mixing in a market that keeps losing out on these shows to the likes of St. Louis or Minneapolis, having Warehouse here offers a delightfully enticing 600-ish person space at an accessible crossroad for music fans across the metro.

The room itself is designed in an elongated space, where an unexpected stretch makes for more opportunities to find yourself front and center for artists, instead of being buried several hundred feet behind a crowd. Along with food, reasonably priced drinks, and dual raised bars with seating, there's hardly a bad view in the house.

Notable among the first round of en-

tertainers were HEALTH, Santigold (with a two-night stint), Destroyer, drag queen balls, raves, and Chiefs watch parties. Between the atmosphere and the spatial arrangement, Warehouse on Broadway has become a new dependable hang for *Pitch* staff on any night of the week. As that listed line-up suggests, the only throughline is that you're going to have a good time—everything else feels random.

We'll also denote that Omaha's dancepunk stalwarts The Faint were among the very first acts to play this space, and for those of us in Pitch orbit who were unaware that they were the maiden voyage, Warehouse will forever be responsible for one of the most puzzling nights of the year. We were at a rock club, sure, but everything was too clean. It felt like we'd wandered onto the set of a music venue that had just been constructed for a CBS sitcom set-no graffiti, no piss, not even a sticky surface. It was disorienting. Luckily, we can verify that drugs were used in the bathroom. Everything is right in the world, and nothing hurts. Again, come find us at Warehouse anytime.

NEW HITS AND OLD FAVES IN FOOD WORLD

You, *Pitch* readers and discerning diners, voted Hank's Garage and Grill as your favorite New Restaurant of the year. Like you, we're glad it has brought another food option to a historic downtown experiencing a revival—all done in a way that looks chill but plays it serious in the kitchen.

New is exciting and necessary, but at *The Pitch*, we're never going to overlook the established, proven, and old-reliable eateries that have earned a spot in Kansas Citians' weekly or monthly meal rotations. For Food & Drink Editor Sarah Sipple, one of the most frequented stops of the last year is Blackhole Bakery.

At 56th & Troost, Blackhole Bakery has mastered the balance of consistency with surprise. New mochi donut flavors are announced each month, but the majority of the menu remains stable year after year, as they've perfected both the recipes and the quantities demanded by the adoring public.

The mochi donuts are a must-get each time, especially the chocolate and anything nut or berry flavored, but don't forget to try a pastry now and then. The savory puff pastry with caramelized onions and goat cheese is the most satisfying baked good in the city, and the creative selection of shmears that accompany bagels could be just the shake-up your day needs. We're excited for them to expand into the West Plaza soon.

New vs. proven, habitual vs. adventurous... both approaches matter when it comes to our plates. It's natural, even practical, to gravitate towards restaurants in your own neighborhood, but we hope you're expanding your palate with new areas and cuisines regularly. If your prideful

KC BBQ opinions are based on a spot you committed to decades ago, and you haven't branched out since then, it's time to get out of your bubble before you're deemed obnoxious in a comment section.

GHOSTED BY THE INSIDIOUS LIVE SHOW

Some of our favorite stories this year are the ones that, frankly, didn't happen at all. Case in point: The Lionsgate horror film series Insidious had a "live show" that was set to hit KC. Insidious: The Further You Fear was billed as an "immersive theatrical event" that, from the video trailer released online, seemed like a mix of haunted house and scientific showmanship—promising to also bring the "real" Specs and Tucker, the actual paranormal investigators who inspired the original movie. This sort of unspecific summary merged with a performance set for The Kauffman Center (of all places! And with Kauffman Center prices!) gave us an itch at The Pitch for exactly the kind of bizarre adventure that we took this gig to cov-

Unfortunately, *Insidious* ghosted us. The night of the show, hours before the doors opened, a PR team reached out to let us know the event would not be happening, and even they seemed stunned and uncertain about what led to this. Turns out, the show had opened a few nights earlier, and audiences in Detroit and Omaha had left in fits of fury. Demands for refunds had come flooding in, we found out, after a half-baked evening of crowd work (with obviously planted actors) merged with an evening devoid of special effects, and ending suddenly and unexpectedly with no explanation.

In reading the bewildered, furious, or straight frenzied reactions from the other early audiences, who presumed they had perhaps been part of a *Nathan for You*-style prank or social experiment, we're still sore over missing our chance to be the final stop of an apparently near-historic horrorshow—for all the wrong reasons.

To the producers of *The Conjuring*: the ball is in your court. We'll be seated.

EXCLUSIVE INCLUSIVITY AT IN GOOD COMPANY

At In Good Company, the mission is revealed in the name: an exclusively inclusive cocktail lounge dedicated to fostering great company and crafting exceptional drinks. Co-founders Cedric Ransburg and Daniel Edwards lead the way in this membership-based lounge in the Crossroads. So, what does it mean to be "exclusively inclusive"?

IGC offers a variety of memberships ranging from \$25 to \$250 per month. Each membership offers a varying number of drink credits, bottle credits, and additional guest invites. The purpose of the membership is not profit; even the cost of the base membership at \$50 (\$25 for educators) is

balanced out with the four drink credits. Instead, it's a symbolic gesture to show that members are intentional about wanting to pour into the space. While IGC is inclusive of all backgrounds, it is also exclusively for those truly desiring to be there.

The lounge's cozy, inviting ambiance is defined by plush living room-style furniture and industrial exposed plumbing. IGC also hosts a variety of events and regularly has a DJ. The layout of the space is a reflection of Ransburg's experiences in the service industry from Kansas City to California, and with every cocktail poured at In Good Company, more unforgettable moments are on the horizon.

BENDING THE TERM 'BARBECUE' AT LOS HORNOS

KC has more to offer than just BBQ... or at least, more than just KC-style BBQ. Owner

Isolina de la Vega has brought South American flavors and traditions to the metro, thereby adding to the color of our culinary scene.

At Los Hornos in North Kansas City, asado is the name of the game—a social setting enhanced by sizzling meats on the grill with sides to tie it together. The restaurant serves a variety of traditional Argentinian foods, including choripán and empanadas. The star, however, is the Asado Argentino: a platter of grilled meats accompanied by a side of chimichurri sauce. One variation of this is the parrillada, which includes chorizo (sausage) or morcilla (blood sausage), brisket, molleja (sweetbread), beef short ribs, and pork rose meat, typically complemented with a side of fries and mayochimi.

De la Vega represents Los Hornos as

an Argentinian native, and her experiences bleed through from top to bottom. Argentinian jerseys and artwork adorn the dining room, while you can also find traditional teas and pastries available for sale. However, the true essence of Argentina shines most when partaking in the traditional Argentinian Asado. Step out to NKC and broaden your barbecue perspective.

GOAT & RABBIT KEEPS US COMING BACK FOR MORE COCKTAILS

Goat & Rabbit has carved out its spot on 39th Street with cocktails that push past the ordinary. The menu blends classics like the espresso martini with inventive options built on unexpected flavors like roasted shishitos, Thai basil, and yuzu.

At one point this year, their menu consisted of drinks like the Plum Luck, made with Kanbe's Market plum syrup and rosewater. And Yuzu You, Boo, a specialty cocktail made with a blend of gin, yuzu curacao, roasted shishitos, and Thai basil, showcasing a mix of local sourcing and unexpected flavor play. Even the mocktails are crafted with the same care, making Goat & Rabbit a spot where non-drinkers aren't left out of the fun.

The lounge itself sets the tone. The vibe is always relaxed but intentional, stylish without being pretentious, and buzzing enough to feel alive whether you're there for happy hour or a late-night round.

When paired with the bar's friendly, knowledgeable staff, the experience feels less like a night out at a cocktail bar and more like being welcomed into a neighborhood favorite that just happens to have world-class drinks.

MO SUPREME COURT SAVES MISSOURI WEED-CONSUMERS MILLIONS EACH MONTH

Since October 2023, Missouri cannabis consumers have been taxed double the amount that the law intended when voters passed legal recreational cannabis in the state. The Missouri Constitution permits municipalities to implement a 3% sales tax on all recreational cannabis products. Where municipalities were not implementing the 3%, the county could then

along the lines, wires were crossed, and both municipalities and counties were taxing 3%, leading to consumers paying an overall 6% sales tax.

On July 22, the Missouri Supreme Court ruled 6-1 to end the double-stacking taxes. In turn, Missourians are set to save a total of \$3 million per month, according to the Missouri Cannabis Trade Association (MoCannTrade).

Nearly two years later, cannabis users in the Show-Me State can finally save the extra pocket change when they head to the dispensary to purchase products.

BARAMEE THAI BISTRO GAINS FULFILLMENT THROUGH MAKING YOU FULL


Baramee Thai Bistro has been serving Kansas City since 2019, when Thai native and chef-owner Nutnisa Hoffman opened the doors with her husband, Doug. The word baramee can mean "fulfilling yourself by making others happy," and the restaurant lives up to that promise with dishes rooted in Northeastern Thai traditions.

By sourcing fresh produce from City Market and working with local growers, Baramee Thai Bistro delivers plates with a bright, balanced punch. It has become one of Kansas City's go-to spots for bold, reliable Thai food without the fuss. The atmosphere is relaxed and welcoming—casual enough for a quick lunch or a prolonged stay on the leafy patio or in the uncomplicated dining room that makes it just as easy to linger over dinner.

The menu covers all the essentials: pad Thai, pad kee mao, curries, and fried rice, but regulars know to branch out. The Baramee Thai Catfish, topped with a sweet-spicy sam rod sauce, is a standout, and the Baramee platter makes the perfect shareable starter with its mix of spring rolls, crab rangoon, and dipping sauces. Portions are generous, flavors are balanced, and there are plenty of vegetarian options.

To round it out, the bar serves cocktails that echo the kitchen's bright, fresh approach—think Thai basil, ginger, and citrus—alongside bubble tea, hot sake, and other drinks that make the menu as versa-

tile as the crowd it attracts.
